### **Holidays:**

February 19th: City Hall, Finance & the Corp. Yard will be closed for Presidents Day.

### **CITY MANAGER:**

#### **CUHS Parking Lot Lease:**

I will be negotiating the Parking Lot Lease Agreement with Jared Caylor, CUHSD Superintendent on February 7<sup>th</sup> for the 3 acres of City property east of the Blackburn Avenue house.

#### **Cub Scout Pack 108 Tour of Council Chambers:**

City Clerk Lisa Linnet will host Cub Scout Pack 108 on a tour of the Council Chambers on February 6, 2017.

#### **Management Staff Sexual Harassment Training:**

City Management Staff will be attending either the morning or afternoon Sexual Harassment Training on February 8<sup>th</sup> at the Red Bluff Department of Education. This training is sponsored by the Tehama County Employer Advisory Council.

#### **Fire Engine Financing:**

Funding to Golden State Fire Apparatus, Inc. is complete from US Bancorp and funds were sent via UPS check on January 31<sup>st</sup>.

### **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

#### **City Roof Repair:**

Roofing Contractor Dan DeLany has informed the Public Works Department that he is scheduled to begin work at 8 a.m. on February 5<sup>th</sup> at the Corning Volunteer Fire Department. He expects that this roof will be completed in 5 days.

#### **Crosswalk Striping Project:**

Apply-A-Line (striping contractor) was in Corning on January 31<sup>st</sup> to begin the school crosswalk striping project. The Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) Grant through the Byrne Criminal Justice Innovation Program (BCJI) will fund this school safety project.

#### **Water Leaks:**

A water main leak was reported on Almond Street between Fig Street and Marguerite Avenue. Repairs will be completed early next week.

**Waterline Project:**

Public Works Director Dawn Grine, Assistant Director Steve Lindeman, and City Engineer Ed Anderson conducted an inspection of the waterline installation and are compiling a list of repairs to present to Broadbent. The entire project will not be complete until road repairs are made this coming spring.

**Local Area Public Works Directors:**

Public Works Director Dawn Grine met with the Public Works Directors from Red Bluff, Anderson and Willows on February 1, 2018. We will be meeting regularly to discuss and compare City operations within our departments. Our next meeting is scheduled for April 5<sup>th</sup> at Corning City Hall.

**POLICE DEPARTMENT:****Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 162 calls for service, a total of 34 officer reports were taken and there were 116 officer-initiated incidents, including 56 traffic stops. Officers made 10 misdemeanor and 9 felony arrests. Officers issued 14 citations, of which; 9 were misdemeanors, 4 were infractions, and 1 was unclassified during the period of January 24, 2018 through January 31, 2018.

**Training:**

This week one officer attended Field Training Officer Update training. The Department's School Resource Officer attended the School Safety Summit at the Department of Education. The Chief attended the NCCSIF meeting in Rocklin and spoke on the topic of School Lockdowns.

**Vehicle Abatement:**

For the month of January, private property vehicle abatement statistics are as follows: 12 letters sent; 4 vehicles towed; 8 vehicles corrected by owner.

**Animal Control:**

Mill Creek Veterinary Clinic in Los Molinos will hold a feline "Feral Friday" event on Friday, February 23, 2018. This clinic is located at 8202 Highway 99E, Los Molinos. Further information can be provided by calling 384-1700.

**FIRE DEPARTMENT:****Fire Department Responses:**

Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 21 incidents the week of January 24-31. They consisted of 16 medical aids and 5 fires. Additionally there were 13 dispatches for Orland Fire.

**Training:**

On Wednesday night, 18 members trained for a total of 27 man hours. The training was split between the Fire Hall and the Burn Training Center. The training involved rapidly and properly donning PPE's (Personal Protective Equipment) and SCBA's (Self Contained Breathing Apparatus). One group worked on escaping a burning room into a safer room, through the wall, and not losing your air source.
