### **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:**

#### **Pilot Waterline Project:**

Broadbent has informed the Public Works Director that the project bonds should arrive at City Hall by Monday. Broadbent has stated that the Project Contractor is on vacation this week and the City should receive a project continuance schedule by early next week.

#### **Safe Routes to School Application:**

NorthStar Engineering has prepared exhibit maps of the two school locations chosen for a Safe Routes to School Application. NorthStar has indicated that they would like to have full size (22"x34") prints of each exhibit for display at the upcoming Council Meeting.

The Public Works Director will be visiting with the SERRF Students at West Street Elementary on July 13<sup>th</sup> to discuss with them and their instructors how the Safe Routes to School Program could mean new sidewalks for them to walk and ride their bikes to and from school.

The Public Works Director will also be promoting the Safe Routes to School Program during the Corning Farmer's Market on July 19<sup>th</sup>.

### **POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

#### **Patrol:**

In addition to responding to 241 calls for service, a total of 39 officer reports were taken and there were 86 officer-initiated incidents, including 47 traffic stops. Officers made 12 misdemeanor and 5 felony arrests. Officers issued 25 citations, of which; 13 were misdemeanors, 6 were infractions, 5 were parking-related, and 1 was animal-related during the period of June 27, 2018 through July 4, 2018.

#### **Training:**

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other Officer Field Training and Dispatcher Training is continuing. This week all sworn officers qualified with the Department's new duty weapons at the range.

**Vehicle Abatement:**

For the month of June, private property statistics are as follows: 44 letters sent, 3 vehicles towed, 20 vehicles corrected by owner, 53 hours spent on abatement.

**FIRE DEPARTMENT:**

**Call Volume:**

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 25 incidents last week; these consisted of 18 medicals, 4 fires, 1 traffic collision, 2 public safety calls.

There were 8 calls dispatched for the Orland and Capay Fire Departments which consisted of 6 medicals and 2 fires.

**Training:**

Fourteen (14) members of the Corning Volunteer Fire Department participated in live wildland fire training with emphasis on safety zones, being observant of surroundings, creating a good anchor point and keeping well hydrated.
