FY 2018/19 Budget:

The Fiscal year 2018/19 Budget will be presented to the City Council on June 26th.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Pilot Waterline Project:

The Tehama County Grant Deed Easement will appear before the Board of Supervisors at their next regularly scheduled meeting on June 26, 2018. Once approved by the Board of Supervisors, the Grant Deed Easement will appear before City Council later that same evening.

Fire Hydrant:

The Public Works Crew replaced a leaking and obsolete fire hydrant located on Colusa near the intersection of Stanmar Drive and Colusa Street.

Meetings:

The Public Works Director will be meeting with NorthStar Engineering on Monday, June 25, 2018 to discuss the Safe Routes to School scope of work and application submission.

The Public Works Director will be meeting with NorthStar Engineering and Caltrans representative Tamy Quigley on June 27, 2018 to discuss the Safe Routes to School scope of work and application submission.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 214 calls for service, a total of 49 officer reports were taken and there were 173 officer-initiated incidents, including 95 traffic stops. Officers made 27 misdemeanor and 0 felony arrest. Officers issued 47 citations, of which; 26 were misdemeanors, 16 were infractions, and 5 were parking-related during the period of June 13, 2018 through June 20, 2018.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other Officer Field Training and Dispatcher Training is continuing. In addition, this week 3 Officers and 1 Dispatcher/Clerk completed Sovereign Citizen Extremist training and 1 Officer attended Taser Instructor Update training.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 24 calls for service last week; these consisted of 18 medical, 4 fires, and 2 public safety. They also dispatched 19 calls for the Orland/Capay Fire Departments which consisted of 11 medicals, 6 fires, 1 traffic collisions, and 1 public service.

Training:

Training for the Corning Volunteer Fire Department consisted of 15 members doing live vegetation training.
