CITY MANAGER:

Food Truck Tuesday Line-Up:

Active Shooter Plan:

Management staff met on March 8th to begin development of an Active Shooter Plan for City Department offices and the Council Chambers based on a template from the Department of Homeland Security. Once the Plans are developed regular trainings will be conducted.

Health Insurance:

Mary Brimm and I will be meeting with CSAC-EIA to discuss a promising health insurance plan. If the proposal is determined to be beneficial to employees, the Health Insurance Committee will be reinstated to review the proposed changes.

City Council Member Appointment:

At the March 6th Special City Council Meeting, the City Council decided to appoint someone to fill the vacancy left by former Council Member Linnet. The appointed Council Member would fill Linnet's remaining term, which is to expire on the first Tuesday in December following the November Elections. Applications are available at City Hall and on the City's website. They are due by 5 p.m. on March 21st.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Corning Little League:

Opening Day for Corning Little League is Saturday, March 10th. The event is scheduled to begin at Clark Park at 9 a.m. If it is raining it will be at the Corning Memorial Hall on the northwest corner of Solano Street and Houghton Avenue.

After opening statements and team introductions they plan to start their first game by 10:00 a.m. with Mayor Doug Hatley tossing the first pitch of the season. Lunch will be served from about 11:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. Hamburgers and hotdogs will be served by the Corning Exchange Club for a cost of \$8.00.

The Little League Volunteers did an amazing job constructing the newly built concession stand/restrooms. The new building along with bleacher repairs and a fresh new paint job gives the Clark Park ball field a brand new look for this community to enjoy for years to come.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 204 calls for service, a total of 33 officer reports were taken and there were 135 officer-initiated incidents, including 49 traffic stops. Officers made 9 misdemeanor and 5 felony arrests. Officers issued 20 citations, of which; 8 were misdemeanors, 7 were infractions, and 5 were parking-related during the period of February 28, 2018 through March 7, 2018.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Two Department Sergeants attended Critical Incident Response for Law Enforcement Supervisor training this week.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Call Volume:

Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 14 calls for service last week. There were also 13 calls for Orland Fire and 5 calls for Capay Fire dispatched.

Training:

The Department is continuing training education to retain their EMR cards. Last week the Chief and 3 Volunteers observed the SCHMRT Team at the Corning Wastewater Treatment Plant to gain information on proper response tactics should the plant experience a chlorine leak at the facility. We observed their entry and command set up.
